Client sample analysis was performed using full evaporative technique (FET) headspace sample delivery and gas chromatographic (GC) compound separation. A combination of flame ionization detection (FID) and/or mass spectrometric (MS) detection with mass spectral confirmation against the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Mass Spectral Database, Revision 2017 were used. Chromatographic and/or mass spectral data were processed by quantitatively comparing the analytical peak areas against calibration curves prepared from certified reference standards.
